DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS

From Reading and West Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike eastbound to Exit 326 (old Exit 24) at Valley Forge. Follow signs for Route 202 South/West Chester Exit 328 (old Exit 26A). Continue on Route 202 South to the Great Valley Exit (Route 29 North). At the first traffic light, turn left onto Swedesford Road. Then take the first left turn into the Penn State Great Valley campus.

From West Chester, Delaware, and South Take Route 202 North to the Great Valley Exit (Route 29 North). Turn right at the end of the ramp and turn right again at the light onto Route 29 North. Continue to the next traffic light and turn right onto Swedesford Road. Continue approximately 2/10s of a mile to the Penn State Great Valley campus on the right.
