Directions to the American College

From Center City Philadelphia and South Jersey

Take I-76 W (Schuylkill Expressway) to I-476 S. Proceed on I-476 S to Exit 13 (US 30-St. Davids/Villanova). Bear right and follow sign for US 30 E (Lancaster Avenue). Proceed on US 30 E for 2.5 miles (12 lights). Make a right onto Bryn Mawr Avenue and follow through 2 lights. The American College is on the right, shortly past the 2nd light.

From the Pennsylvania Turnpike (East of Valley Forge) and North

Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Exit 333 (Norristown/Plymouth Meeting). Proceed through toll plaza and follow signs for I-476 S. Proceed on I-476 S for 8 miles to Exit 13 (US 30-St. Davids/Villanova). Travel on US 30 E (Lancaster Avenue) for 2.5 miles (12 lights). Make a right onto Bryn Mawr Avenue and follow through 2 lights. The American College is on the right, shortly past the 2nd light.

From the Philadelphia International Airport and Delaware

From the Airport, follow signs for I-95 S. From Delaware, take I-95 N. Proceed on I-95. Follow signs for I-476 N (near McDade Blvd. exit). Travel on I-476 N for 14 miles to Exit 13 (US 30-St. Davids/Villanova). Proceed on US 30 E (Lancaster Avenue) for 2.5 miles (12 lights). Make a right onto Bryn Mawr Avenue and follow through 2 lights. The American College is on the right, shortly past the 2nd light.

From King of Prussia, Valley Forge, and Pennsylvania Turnpike (West of Valley Forge)

Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Proceed through tolls onto I-76 E. From the King of Prussia area, take Route 202 to I-76 E (Schuylkill Expressway). Travel on I-76 E to Exit 331A and follow signs for I-476 S (Chester). Proceed on I-476 S to Exit 13 (US 30-St. Davids/Villanova). Follow US 30 E (Lancaster Avenue) for 2.5 miles (12 lights). Make a right onto Bryn Mawr Avenue and follow through 2 lights. The American College is on the right, shortly past the 2nd light.

Dr. Ray English

Ray English has been Director of Libraries at Oberlin College since 1990. He has been active nationally on scholarly communications issues for a number of years. He has been a primary leader of the ACRL scholarly communications program since its inception and he currently chairs the ACRL Scholarly Communications Committee. He has also been a member for many years of the steering committee of SPARC, the Scholarly Publishing and Academic Resources Coalition, and was recently elected chair of the committee. He edits the scholarly communications column for *College and Research Library News* and he writes and speaks frequently on scholarly communications issues in a variety of contexts. He received his A.B. from Davidson College and his Ph.D. and M.A. (in German literature) as well as his MLIS from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Tracey DePellegrin Connelly

Tracey DePellegrin Connelly is Managing Editor of *GENETICS* (<http://www.genetics.org>), a HighWire Press title. HighWire Press is a division of the Stanford University Libraries and "hosts the largest repository of free full-text life science articles in the world."

Dr. William Walters

William H. Walters is an Assistant Professor of Librarianship at Millersville University. His work has appeared in nearly twenty journals, including those of the American Library Association, the Royal Geographical Society, the Gerontological Society of America, the Regional Science Association International, and the British Cartographic Society. His latest paper, on Open Access publishing, is forthcoming in the *Journal of the American Society for Information Science and Technology*. Bill holds a Ph.D. in sociology (demography) from Brown University as well as master's degrees in geography and librarianship.

Dr. Steven H. Weintraub

Steven H. Weintraub is Professor and Chair of the Department of Mathematics at Lehigh University. Lehigh

publishes the *Journal of Differential Geometry*, a leading mathematics journal, which is distributed in print by International Press and electronically by Project Euclid. Prof. Weintraub is an active research mathematician, the author of approximately 50 research papers and 5 books. He was the lead organizer of a 1-day conference "Scientific Publishing: What Does the Future Hold?" held at Lehigh in November 2005, and he serves on the Committee on Publications of the American Mathematical Society.
