### Directions to Penn State Great Valley

LOCATION: 30 E. Swedesford Road, Malvern, PA  
Main Building

#### \* From Southbound 202 \*

1. Take the Great Valley Exit (Route 29 North).
2. At the first traffic light, turn left onto Swedesford Road. Then take the first left turn into Penn State Great Valley.
3. As you enter the driveway into the Campus, the Main Building is the one on the right.

#### From Philadelphia

1. Follow the Schuylkill Expressway (I-76 West) to Valley Forge.
2. Then follow signs for Route 202 South/West Chester Exit 328 (old Exit 26B).
3. Continue with directions for Southbound 202 above.

#### From Reading and West

1. Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike eastbound to Exit 326 (old Exit 24) at Valley Forge.
2. Follow signs for Route 202 South/West Chester Exit 328 (old Exit 26A).
3. Continue with directions for Southbound 202 above.

#### From Allentown and North

1. Take I-476 South to Exit 16 to merge onto I-76 West toward Valley Forge.
2. Take Exit 328B-A to merge onto US-202 South toward West Chester
3. Continue with directions for Southbound 202 above.

#### From West Chester or Delaware

1. Take Route 202 North to the Great Valley Exit.
2. Turn right at the end of the ramp and turn right again at the light onto Route 29 North.
3. Continue to the next traffic light and turn right onto Swedesford Road.
4. Continue approximately 2/10 mile to Penn State Great Valley on the right. As you enter the driveway into the Campus, the Main Building is the one on the right.

# Putting Librarians in *THEIR* Place: A Fresh Look at Outreach

Academic librarians are finding new and different ways of interacting with students and faculty, many of which take us beyond the walls of the library. In the morning session, we will hear Martin Kesselman of Rutgers University speaking on “Embedded Librarianship: New Roles Based on Traditional Values.” His talk will address the various ways librarians are weaving their services into courses, academic departments, and even international research partnerships.

Wayne Bivens-Tatum will then give a talk entitled “Seize the Day: Entrepreneurial Librarianship.” Are you wondering what an entrepreneurial librarian is? Someone who seizes opportunities, is tenacious, and has a desire to continually evaluate and improve services to a user community. He will discuss the strategies and techniques he developed on the way to becoming an integral member of and information service provider for an academic department at Princeton University.
