Directions to Penn State Great Valley

LOCATION: 30 E. Swedesford Road, Malvern, PA
Main Building

* From Southbound 202 *

1. Take the Great Valley Exit (Route 29 North).
2. At the first traffic light, turn left onto Swedesford Road. Then take the first left turn into Penn State Great Valley.
3. As you enter the driveway into the Campus, the Main Building is the one on the right.

From Philadelphia

1. Follow the Schuylkill Expressway (I-76 West) to Valley Forge.
2. Then follow signs for Route 202 South/West Chester Exit 328 (old Exit 26B).
3. Continue with directions for Southbound 202 above.

From Reading and West

1. Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike eastbound to Exit 326 (old Exit 24) at Valley Forge.
2. Follow signs for Route 202 South/West Chester Exit 328 (old Exit 26A).
3. Continue with directions for Southbound 202 above.

From Allentown and North

1. Take I-476 South to Exit 16 to merge onto I-76 West toward Valley Forge.
2. Take Exit 328B-A to merge onto US-202 South toward West Chester
3. Continue with directions for Southbound 202 above.

From West Chester or Delaware

1. Take Route 202 North to the Great Valley Exit.
2. Turn right at the end of the ramp and turn right again at the light onto Route 29 North.
3. Continue to the next traffic light and turn right onto Swedesford Road.
4. Continue approximately 2/10 mile to Penn State Great Valley on the right. As you enter the driveway into the Campus, the Main Building is the one on the right.

Going Green: Big Ideas, Small Steps

We've all heard of "green buildings" - certified as built and operated in an environmentally-friendly manner. But you can advocate and practice Green Librarianship even if you are not building a brand new "green" library building at this time. Librarians can take various steps to green their existing environments, as well as provide information on green resources and best practices for their patrons.

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The morning session will start with ACRL National President Erika Linke speaking about purposeful advocacy, which focuses on our external communications and encompasses professional, governmental, local, and personal actions. She will address the ways that librarians can best use their voices, personally and collectively, to influence the pressing issues of our day.

Next, we will hear from Frederick Stoss of the University at Buffalo--SUNY speaking on "Greener Solutions: Actions after the Inconveniences of Truths." His talk will review the role of the information profession in environmental protection, including past successes and future initiatives.

For the afternoon session, we have put together a panel of three experts from Penn State University. The panelists will share their experiences on how to build a green library as well as the experience of "living" in one and what a library that was not built as a green library could do to become more green.
